ESTABLISH A NEW SCHOOL

Notice is hereby given in accordance with section 28(1) of the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 that Wirral Borough Council as the local education authority intends to establish a new Community Primary school for 430 boys and girls mainly between the ages of 4 and 11 from September 2005.

The school is to be situated at

Bramwell Avenue, Prenton, Wirral, CH43 0SR

Applications for school transport to alternative schools will be considered on the basis of the LEA's published school transport policy available on request from Education and Cultural Services Department, Conway Street, Birkenhead and published in the LEA's information booklets for parents.

The number of pupils to be admitted to the school at age 4 from September 2005 and subsequent years will be 60.

There are opportunities for development offered by an amalgamated school, including the opportunity to offer consistent provision across the whole age range, both in curriculum terms and the provision made before and after the end of the school day. Parents and children can develop closer contact with the staff and Headteacher over a longer period of time. There are also opportunities for increased educational contact between younger and older children, including siblings.

The admission authority of the proposed school will be the LEA.
